
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EV Fast-Track

• Encourage local and regional planning that supports state goals, implements Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Sustainable Communities Strategies (SCS) (where applicable), and to ultimately achieve the State's greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction target of 40 and 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2030 and 2050, respectively

Climate Adaptation Planning Grants (\$50 million)

 support local and regional identification of transportation-related climate vulnerabilities through the development of climate adaptation plans, as well as project-level adaptation planning to identify adaptation projects and strategies for transportation infrastructure

Strategic Partnerships Grants (\$4.5 million)

 Identify and address statewide, interregional, or regional transportation deficiencies on the State highway system in partnership with Caltrans. A subcategory funds transit-focused planning projects that address multimodal transportation deficiencies

Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP)

Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)





Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP)

Provides operating and capital assistance for transit agencies to reduce green house gas emissions and improve mobility.

- Since 2015, the LCTOP program is responsible for reducing 6,326,706 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent.
- 96% of all LCTOP project funding has been allocated to benefit Priority Populations totaling \$748,767,966.
- In 2022, LCTOP selected it's 1,000th project for funding and highlighted in the California Air Resources Board annual report to the Legislature.





Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) FY 2022-2023

- FY 2022-23: \$192,371,705 for eligible LCTOP projects.
- Project allocation requests are due to LCTOP Program Liaisons, for review, by May 1, 2023.
- Anticipated funding dates for LCTOP approved projects is September 2023.





LCTOP's Streamline Application & Reporting Process

- Streamlined application process for free or reduced fare projects.
 Allows operators to submit one application every four years.
- Updated project reporting cycle from semi-annual to annual, allowing operators more time to plan & implement projects.
- LCTOP is a great funding-source to purchase ZEV and technology conversions that support ZEV infrastructure.





- SunLine Transit's Fuel Cell Buses & Hydrogen Onsite Generation Refueling Station was the first of it's kind and partially funded by LCTOP.
- (Pictured left): One of SunLine's new Fuel Cell Electric Buses
- (Pictured right): Electrolyzer hydrogen production plant, produces on-site solar electricity, which is converted to hydrogen and stored on-site and connects to the hydrogen fueling station.





Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)

- The TIRCP Program provides grants from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF) to fund transformative capital improvements that will modernize California's rail and transit systems.
- ▶ TIRCP receives a portion of revenues established by SB1 and a continuous appropriation of 10 percent from the GGRF via quarterly Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds.
- Call for Projects and application submittal typically occurs every two years
 - California's 2022-23 State Budget includes an additional \$7.65 billion in TIRCP funding from the General Fund, which has allowed the current off cycle call for projects happening right now.
